Dear Valued Customer,

Thank you for your inquiry regarding Eaton's compliance with the provisions of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act (the "Act") pertaining to the use of tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold, as well as derivatives thereof and any other mineral or its derivatives determined by the United States Secretary of State ("Designated Minerals") originating from the Democratic Republic of Congo and neighboring countries ("DRC").

Eaton seeks to use compliant minerals that are sourced from Conflict-Free sources and has implemented processes within our supply chain to support this effort. We currently are unaware of any Designated Minerals being used in our supply chain that have originated in a conflict zone of the DRC. However, due to our position as a downstream manufacturer we do not have sufficient information to conclusively determine the countries of origin, chain of custody, or specific smelters of Designated Minerals in our products.
